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
LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

United States Army





During her 11-year military career, Lourdes tackled three diverse specialties and participated in numerous special missions. She spent three years promoting the Army National Guard as a Marketing Specialist on a mobile recruiting team in 43 states. Afterward, she volunteered to assist in California's forest fires mission, working alongside wildland firefighters. As a recruiter, she guided civilians toward service opportunities. Her path led her to Chicago due to a PCS move, where she ventured into real estate, assisting veterans and service members with VA home loan benefits. Between 1997 and 2002, he served with distinction in Society of Civil Engineers the US Navy as a Naval Aircrewman, amassing over 1500 flight hours as an In-Flight Technician aboard the P-3 Orion aircraft. His dedication shone in Persian Gulf tactical sorties for Operations Southern Watch and Enduring Freedom, as well as combat missions in Afghanistan in support of the Global War on Terror, earning him the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement diseases that afflict Medal.

Charles holds a Bachelor Engineering from the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC). While at UIC, he not only excelled academically but also assumed leadership as the president of the American (ASCE) student chapter. He co-founded "Veterans in Engineering," an organization aiding veterans returning from military service. His humanitarian pursuits led him to Central America as part of UIC's Engineers Without Borders, contributing to the design and implementation of a drinking water distribution system in rural Guatemala, aimed at combating children.

With 15 years of experience as a licensed Professional Engineer in infrastructure planning, he worked at two mid-sized engineering firms before co-founding Orion Engineers in 2015. Beyond his professional life, Charles is deeply committed to aiding the homeless and supporting vulnerable children. He also serves as the Post President of the Society of American Military Engineers (SAME), dedicated to fundraising for veterans' service organizations and charitable causes. Charles calls Chicago home, residing with his partner Dafne and their two middle school children, Will and Sofia.

Teresa Dawn Furr is from a small North Carolina town. At 19, she ventured into the U.S. Navy. Specializing in submarine communications, her naval career unfolded at K.I. Sawyer AFB in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. It was there that she encountered Joseph Long, an Air Force veteran, and together they have shared 33 years of marriage, raised three children, and cherished three loyal dogs.

During Active Duty, Teresa experienced a traumatic brain injury that led to her medical release from service. With the unwavering support of the VBA, she underwent vocational rehabilitation, culminating in the attainment of a Bachelor's degree in Education. For 15 years, she taught in Chicago, but unaddressed mental health issues prompted her to leave her teaching career behind.

With the guidance of the VA and her psychiatrist, Teresa received the help she needed and was introduced to resources such as Compensated Work Therapy (CWT). This transformative experience eventually led her to a fulfilling role at Hines VA, where she initially worked at the Psychosocial Rehabilitation and Recovery Center (PRRC) as a PSA. Following her acquisition of a Peer Support certification, she transitioned to a role as a Peer Specialist.

As a Peer Specialist on the inpatient unit, she often assumes the role of Veteran's Advocate, ensuring their voices are heard and that they receive the highest quality care. She conducts group sessions and one-on-one meetings with veterans. Additionally, she plays a vital role in collecting veteran feedback as they exit the unit and collaborates with mental health leadership to implement necessary changes to enhance the quality of care for all veterans.



Eden Puente was born and raised in the south suburbs of Chicago. Enlisting in the U.S Army after the tragic events of 9/11, he went on to deploy for OEF and OIF. Eden was wounded in action on his last day in country when his unit was hit with an IED, slamming Puente's head against the frame of the humvee. He sustained a TBI and shrapnel to his wrist, knuckles, and lower If all can do back; he received a Purple Heart for his wounds.

> Like most veterans returning home from war, Eden struggled to find community. It wasn't until he asked for help and attended his first veteran event, The Chicago Veterans Ruck March, that doors started to open for him.

He would soon after attend and graduate from DePaul University with both a Bachelor's and Master's in Business Administration.

His proudest achievement was during the pandemic, he worked with the Travis Manion Foundation giving away over 55,000 lbs. of food to over 1,800 families. He was honored as an Honor Roll recipient of the George H.W. Bush Points of Light Award for his incredible work.

In 2019, Eden met his mentor, PGA Professional Juan Espejo. They started a program dedicated to growing the game of golf for all veterans.

Through their program, veterans learn the game of golf while developing an understanding of positive psychology and character development. It was through the lessons that Eden was crowned National Champion of the Wounded Division by the Veterans Golfers Association (VGA).

Eden Puente is currently the Midwest Senior Coordinator for the Travis Manion Foundation, which works to empower veterans and families of fallen heroes through mentorship and other programs.
